## It's time for a groundbreaking

### Ceremony June 10 kicks off a series of Habitat events

The groundbreaking ceremony for the first home being built by Habitat for Humanity of Seneca County will be at 10 a.m. on Saturday, June 10.

The ceremony will be at 27 Adams St. in Seneca Falls, the site of the home which will be built by volunteers from around Se-

nenca County and by Susan Tribble of Seneca Falls, who has been selected as the home's buyer.

The brief ceremony will kickoff a week of Habitat events. The annual Canal Fest in Seneca Falls will begin at noon that day. On Wednesday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, the second annual Habitat for

Humanity Golf Tournament will take place at Silver Creek Golf Club in Waterloo.

Excavation of the basement for the one-story home at 27 Adams St. is expected to begin on Monday, June 12. Once the foundation is complete, volunteers will gather to begin the job of framing the home.

Susan Tribble and her two children were selected from among those who applied to buy the house. She will be required to work

on the home during its construction and will purchase it for the construction cost when the home is complete.

Our affiliate will hold the no-interest mortgage on the property.

Volunteer sign-up sheets have been circulating in the community for some time as we will need to schedule volunteers for work based on the skills needed at any time. If you haven't filled out a volunteer form yet, you can fill it out on the affiliate web page or pick up a copy at the Habitat office or any Habitat events, including the groundbreaking.
