Officers, Board Members elected

At its annual meeting on June 13, a new president and several new board members were elected for Habitat for Humanity of Seneca County.

Menzo Case of Seneca Falls, who previously served as affiliate treasurer, will rejoin the board and become the affiliate's fourth president.

He will replace Martin Toombs of Seneca Falls, president the past two years.

Toombs and two other founding board members will be leaving the board at the end of June because they have reached the six-year limit for board members. The other founding members ending their board service are John Scanlon of Fayette, the affiliate's first president, and Robert Nelson of Seneca Falls, who called the first meeting in 1998 to discuss the affiliate's formation.

In addition to Case, one other former board member is returning. Marilyn McDougal of Waterloo, who also served two years as affiliate president, was re-elected to the board after a year's absence also forced by a term limitation. She has headed the affiliate's Site Selection

committee since it was formed and continued in that role while being off the board.

Five others were newly elected to board seats: Judy Toombs, Marvin Lay, Fran Wenderlich, Dorothy Dickieson and Neil LeRoux, all

of Seneca Falls. Two existing board members were re-elected: Cate Blakemore of Seneca Falls and David Mayne of Waterloo.

In addition to Case's election as president, Wayne Lohr of Seneca Falls was elected vice president. Elaine Scott of Interlaken was re-elected secretary and Bonnie Morlang of Waterloo was re-elected treasurer.

The changes are effective July 1.



Search for next home site continues

The affiliate is still looking for the site for its next Habitat project.

We hope to be able to break ground this year on our next home, but we need to find a location soon to make that possible.

While we are open to sites anywhere in the county, we'd prefer a site in the Waterloo or Romulus school districts, since we've yet to build a home there.

Nearly all the applications we have received for our four previous projects have been from families who lived in the school district where the house was located.

We have now done two projects in the Seneca Falls School District



and two in the South Seneca School District and so would like to do our next project in the Waterloo or Romulus districts.

Our first preference would be the donation of a lot, since that would allow funds we have raised through other efforts to be used on construction. We have received an \$8,000 grant through Habitat for Humanity International which could be used to purchase property for our next project, if necessary.

The site needs to be suited for home construction, large enough to meet the relevant zoning and health codes.
